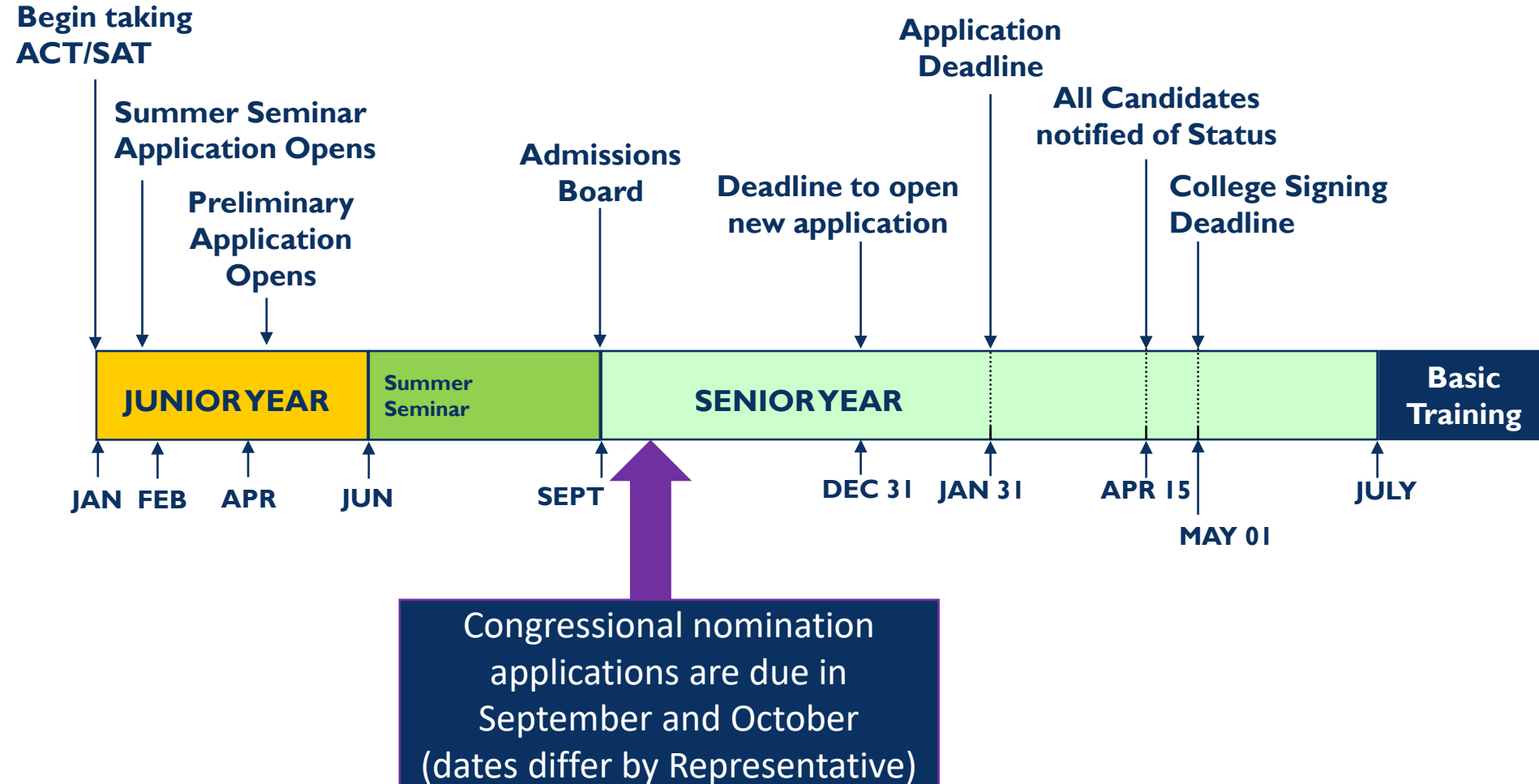

Own your application process

- Know deadlines

Don't give up!

- Application process is much more detailed and tedious than civilian universities (on purpose!)

Nomination process as a mini application within the overall Academies' applications

If you're interested, get yourself qualified

- You need to be a scholar / athlete / leader

Medical Exam

- Administered through DODMERB (DoD Medical Evaluation Review Board are **not** Academy personnel)
- Often the most time-consuming part of the process

WHO DO I APPLY TO?

- You **MUST** apply directly to the academies of your choice. Applying to congressional offices is only one part of the process.
- You are encouraged to apply for a nomination from all nominating sources.
- Each U.S. Representative has their own process.

Timelines

Spring 2023 - JUNIOR YEAR - Congressional Offices open the application process.

Fall 2023 - SENIOR YEAR - Applications are due, commonly in early October.

December 2023 - January 2024 - Students are notified of their status by Congressional offices.

- Congressional offices submit their nomination slates to the Academies in January.

Spring 2024 – Student notification of appointment status and offers come directly from the Academies.

Application Information (continued)

Letters of Recommendation

- Ask each recommender to address all letters to the correct office.
(example: Dear Senators Bennet and Hickenlooper or Dear Representative DeGette)
- Have your recommender put your letter on the letterhead of their school or organization, as appropriate.
- Please have one of your letters come from a Teacher, School Counselor, or Principal.
- We prefer each letter has a handwritten or, if necessary, an electronic signature.



Your Qualifications

We use a “Whole Person” approach when considering applicants for a nomination, which include attributes like:

- Diverse leadership qualities
- Competitive test scores and grade point average
- Efforts at self-improvement
- Commitment to service: Community and Country
- Patriotism



Interview Process

An Invitation to interview: Once your completed application has been reviewed, you may be invited to interview with congressional offices.

Learn more about the process: Contact individual offices to learn more about their interview process. Typically, you will be interviewed by a panel of members of the community.

Interviews in October thru December:

This years interviews will be primarily in person with a virtual option to accommodate logistical issues.



Interview Logistics

Confirm Your Interview - Be sure of the date, time, and location of the interview and the office you will be interviewing with.

Test Your Technology – If virtual, be sure your technology is working properly to avoid last minute issues, and contact the Nomination Coordinator immediately if you have a problem.

Be Prepared – Enlist family or friends to do a practice interview, answering questions you think you may be asked.



Receiving a Nomination

- Receiving a nomination is just one step in the process. You must also apply for an appointment to the Academy associated with the nomination you may receive.
- Congressional offices must notify the Academies of their nominations no later than January 31, 2024.
- If you are offered a nomination and choose to decline the offer, another student will be offered the nomination.
- Nominations are not transferrable between Academies.



Helpful Hints

- REVIEW each congressional office's application requirements.
- Review all materials you are submitting. PROOFREAD.
- ASK QUESTIONS. Feel free to contact the Nominations Coordinator in each office.

- May 1st: Application for a nomination through the office of Congressman Joe Neguse *opens*
- October 1st: Application *closes*
- October 15th: Qualified applicants receive offer to schedule an in-person interview.
- End of October/Beginning of November: Interviews will be held, exact dates, TBD.
- Mid December: Nominees are notified
- January 31st: All congressional nominations will be submitted to their respective academies.

The Process

APPLICANTS SEEKING APPOINTMENT TO A SERVICE ACADEMY MUST DO TWO THINGS:

1. Secure a nomination from a member of Congress or the Vice President, and
2. Gain acceptance from the academy's own application process

SECURING A NOMINATION FROM CONGRESSWOMAN BOEBERT

1. Submit an application through Representative Boebert's website. Applications will open on June 5th and will close on October 1st. You will be prompted to fill out our application and submit supporting materials and upon receipt, you will receive our essay question for this year.
2. Continue to update your application if you receive new test scores or have additional information to add until applications close.
3. Attend a board interview if passed the application process:
Our office will contact you to schedule a time for a board interview. Interviews are conducted by a panel of community leaders and military veterans some of whom have gone through an Academy and play a key role in determining who will receive a nomination, along with your grades, extracurriculars, and essay. Interviews will take place in November at our Grand Junction District Office and our Pueblo District Office. These dates are TBD.
4. Congresswoman Boebert will notify successful nominees in December.
5. Our office will submit nominations prior to the deadline of January 31st.

Advice For Applicants

- Applicants should apply through each congressional office-Congresswoman Boebert and both Senators Bennet and Hickenlooper. While each office is allotted a limited number of nomination slots, we will coordinate to maximize the number of nominated Coloradans.
- Applicants should apply to all academies in which they are interested and indicate their preference in our application. Applicants not selected for their first choice may gain selection for another choice. For example, the Naval Academy produces nearly as many fighter pilots as the Air Force Academy-do not limit yourself to a single option.
- Applicants who are not nominated are strongly urged to reapply the following year. A high number of those who gain admission have applied multiple times.

CALENDAR OF BEST PRACTICES

April, May and June:

- Take your ACT/SAT tests early. (Schedule it Now)
- Request three (3) Letters of Recommendations early.
- Start your application online opens (April 1, 2023)

July, Aug and September:

- Retake ACT/SAT test if needed
- Upload Letters of Recommendations
- Prepare for your interview

October :

- Deadline for Applications on Oct 1, 2023 (Midnight)
- Arrive early for interview October 28, 2023

December:

- Acceptance of Nominations to the military academies

Jan, February, March and April

- Notification of Appointment(s) by the military academies



- Consider applying to all Service Academies.
- Take as many upper-level science and math courses as you can and take on leadership roles.
- Don't hesitate to ask if you are unsure about something in the application process.
- Ensure your application is uploaded to the correct Congressional District.
- Don't have your parents call the office. This is your application not theirs.
- Don't submit your application LATE as it will not be considered.
- Spend time learning about the Military and it's practices

Steps for Applying (Please read the following in its entirety):

1. Your Nomination Application will **not** be considered complete until you have submitted both of the following:
 1. Complete the online webform registration
 2. Scanned and emailed your completed PDF application packet to doug.lamborn05@mail.house.gov
2. Complete the PDF application. **Save the completed version to your computer desktop.**
3. **SAT/ACT/High School Transcript documents** - Scan the summary pages showing the composite scores for your SAT and/or ACT as well as your High School Transcripts. **Save it to your computer desktop. ***WE ARE AWARE THAT TESTING DATES HAVE BEEN DELAYED DUE TO COVID-19. IF YOU HAVE NOT YET COMPLETED A STANDARDIZED TEST – PLEASE INPUT “0” IN BOTH YOUR APPLICATION AND IN THE ONLINE WEBFORM. YOU CAN EMAIL YOUR NEW OR UPDATED SCORES WHEN YOU RECEIVE THEM to Elizabeth.Tapia@mail.house.gov (subject line: Test Scores for John Doe)*****

1. Choose a photograph – it must be a clear digital image that will be used as an 8x11 cover page for your application. You can scan a school photo or use a quality cell phone or digital camera. **Save it to your computer desktop.**
2. Compose a one page 500-word essay entitled, “Why I Want to Attend a U.S. Service Academy – By John Doe”. **Save it to your computer desktop.**
3. **THREE LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:** Every letter of recommendation should provide the contact information of the recommender. There are three options for providing letters of recommendation.
 1. Instruct the 3 individuals to provide the letters of recommendation to you the applicant and then attach the three letters to your PDF application.
 2. OR submit your application without the letters of recommendation attached and have the three recommenders scan and email their letters directly to the Nomination Coordinator, Elizabeth Tapia at: Elizabeth.Tapia@mail.house.gov
 3. OR submit your application without the letters of recommendation attached and have the recommenders mail them to my district office to the attention of Elizabeth Tapia at: 1125 Kelly Johnson Blvd., Suite 330, Colorado Springs, CO 80920.
4. **SCAN AND EMAIL YOUR PDF APPLICATION PACKET:** Your PDF application packet should include the following documents in the following order: Photograph page, Essay, PDF application, High School Transcripts, Standardized Test Scores (if available at the time), and three letters of recommendation. As mentioned above, if the recommendation letters are not completed yet, you can submit your application packet without your three letters of recommendation. However, if you submit your application packet without the letters of recommendation, please have the three recommenders email/mail their letters directly to doug.lamborn05@mail.house.gov

IMPORTANT:

1. Letters of recommendation can be obtained from your current or former principal, counselors, teachers, employers, ministers, or other community, government, or business leaders. Although it is not required, we recommend that at least one letter is from your school principal or counselor. Please ask that they use their official letterhead, if applicable, and to provide their name, address, phone, and email on their correspondence. They can scan their letter and email it to Elizabeth.Tapia@mail.house.gov or mail it to the address listed above.
2. Please provide an “Unweighted” GPA. If your school doesn’t use unweighted GPA’s ask a school official to assist you with the conversion process.

1. We do not use a “super-score” for SAT/ACTs. Please provide the composite score(s) and make sure that the scores you input into the web form and the application match your documents. We only use composite scores. We are aware due to Covid-19, the testing dates have been delayed. Please provide previous scores if available and when you receive your updated scores, email them directly to doug.lamborn05@mail.house.gov
2. When choosing your preferred academy (on the 2nd page of the PDF application) – please **only** list those in which you have opened a candidate file or those that you **plan to pursue** upon receiving a nomination. Please enter a “Number” next to the academy, not an “X” if you are pursuing more than one academy (1=1st Choice; 2=2nd Choice, etc.). If you are **not** interested in pursuing a specific academy, please leave the space next to that academy blank.
3. Please visit the Admissions page of your preferred U.S. Service Academy to ensure you meet the minimum entry requirements. Obtaining a nomination is a highly competitive process and is a pre-cursor to admission requirements.
4. Applicants will be asked to attend an in-person interview in mid to late October. You will be notified of the exact date and time via email. Please acknowledge receipt as soon as possible by replying to the email. If you are unable to attend the in-person interview, please respond immediately so that arrangements can be made. You must have a valid reason for not attending the interview.
5. RESULTS: You will be notified of your nomination status typically during the month of December.

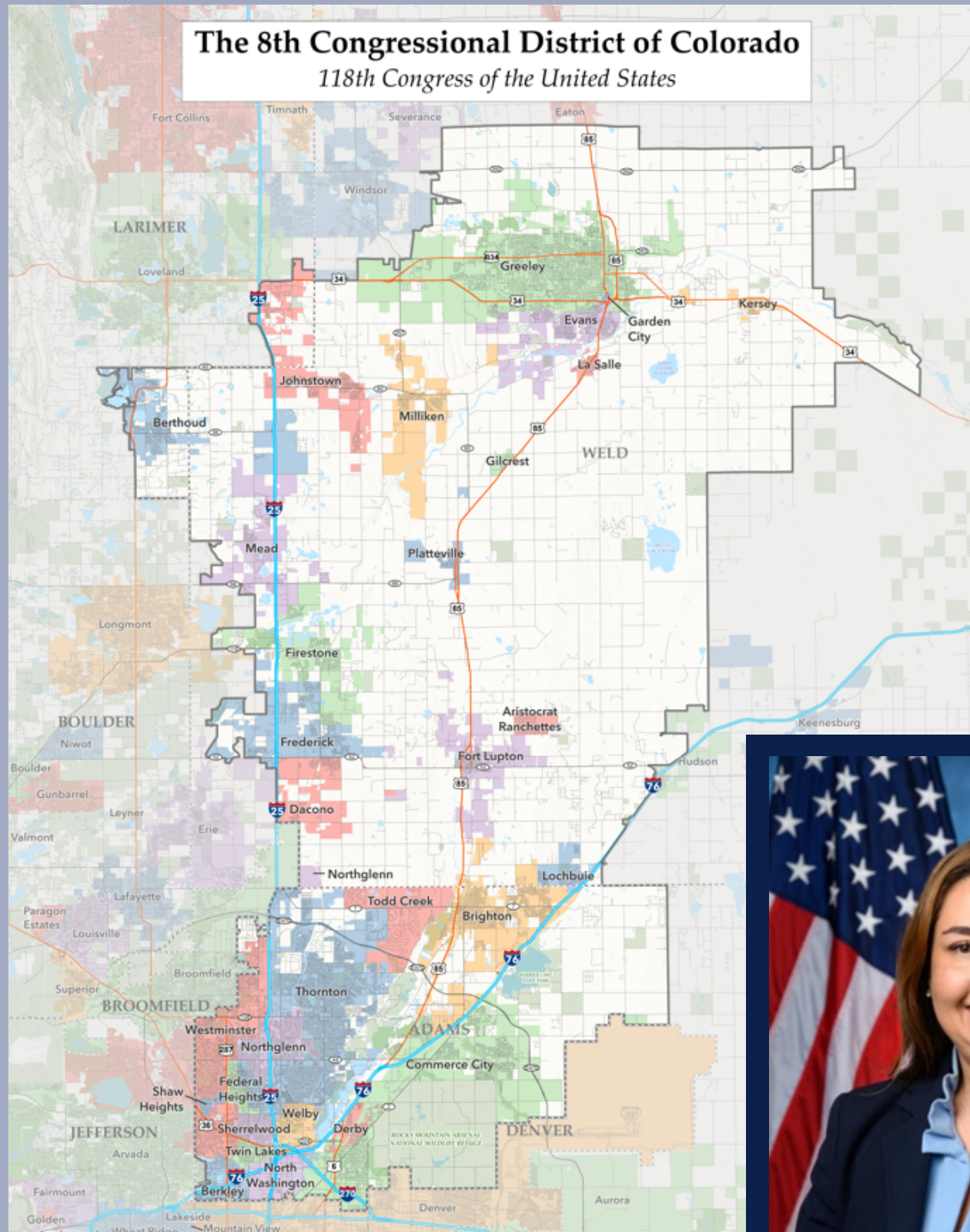

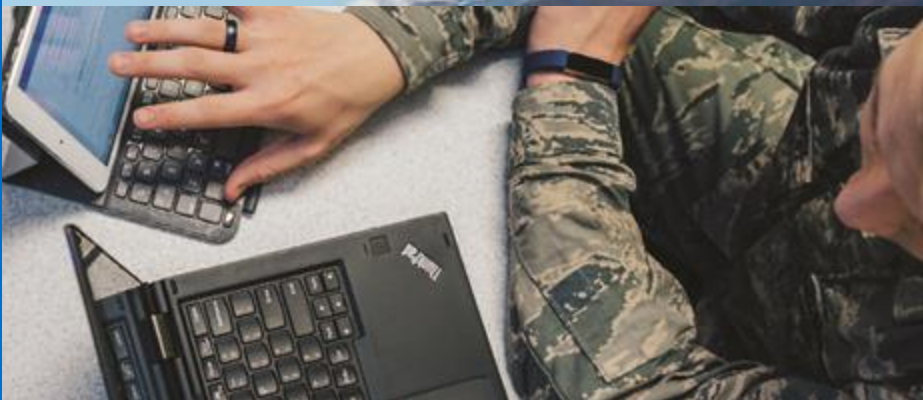

The Details

Service obligation depends on the career field you choose:

- Non-flying careers incur a 4-year obligation

- ☐ Prepare, train, & practice for requirements; **take CFA early; SAT/ACT – test until super-scores plateau**
- ☐ Communicate politely with local Field Force
- ☐ Consider all service branch college ROTC options as backup – especially Army (any academic major)
- ☐ Make the decision that is right for you; do not be reluctant to reapply after 1-2 years of college
- ☐ Attending Boys or Girls State is an easy way to earn leadership points – programs highly valued

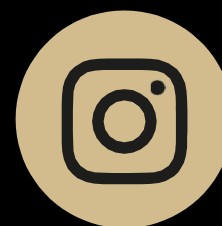

NROTC Scholarship

The NROTC Scholarship is a \$180,000 scholarship to universities with an NROTC program. Upon receiving your degree and graduating from college, you commission as a Marine Officer.

To qualify you must:

- Be a United States Citizen.
- Be at least 17 and no older than 23.
- Must be physically qualified to meet Marine Corps standards.
- Must obtain a basic SAT combined score of 1000 or a 22 composite on the ACT.

With the NROTC scholarship you receive full college tuition, fees, books, and a monthly stipend. Summer training involves leadership and Marine skills at Marine Corps installations.

School Options include:

- Participating Universities include: University of Colorado, University of Nebraska, Arizona State, Texas A&M, UCLA, USC, Notre Dame, Harvard, Yale, and more.

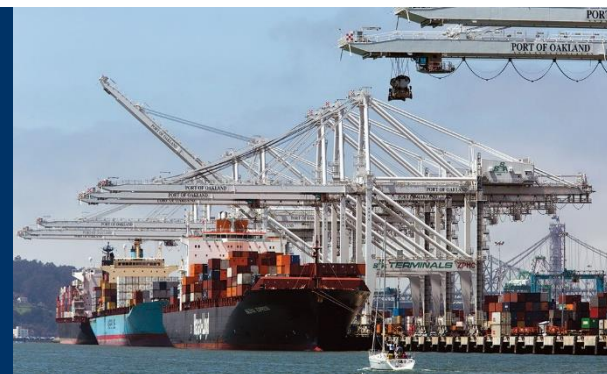

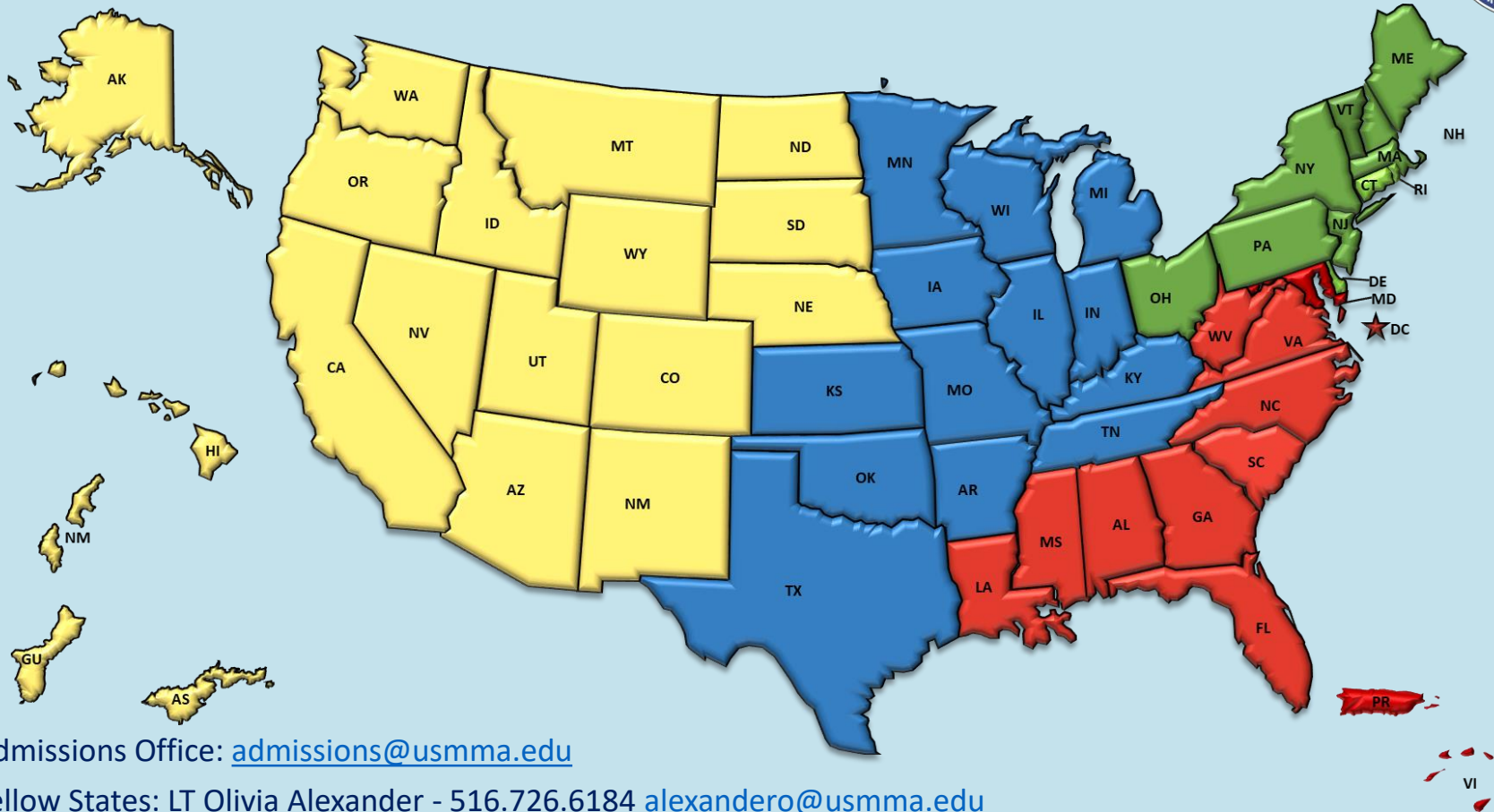

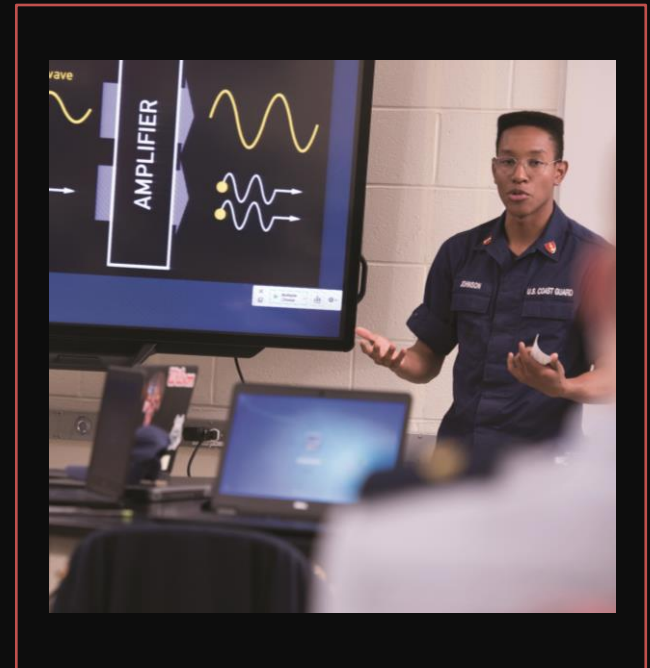
