A BILL

To amend Public Law 91–378 to authorize activities relating to Civilian Conservation Centers, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Civilian Conservation
- 5 Center Enhancement Act of 2025".

6 SEC. 2. CIVILIAN CONSERVATION CENTERS.

Public Law 91–378 (16 U.S.C. 1701 et seq.) is
8 amended by adding at the end the following:

1**"TITLE III—CIVILIAN**2**CONSERVATION CENTERS**

3 "SEC. 301. DEFINITIONS.

4 "In this title:

5 "(1) CIVILIAN CONSERVATION CENTER.—The
6 term 'Civilian Conservation Center' means any resi7 dential workforce development or training facility for
8 underserved youth operated by the Department of
9 the Interior or the Department of Agriculture.

10 "(2) COVERED GRADUATE.—The term 'covered
11 graduate' means an individual who successfully com12 pleted a training program at a Civilian Conservation
13 Center.

14 "(3) COVERED STUDENT.—The term 'covered
15 student' means an individual who is enrolled in a
16 training program at a Civilian Conservation Center.
17 "(4) SECRETARIES.—The term 'Secretaries'
18 means—

19 "(A) the Secretary of Agriculture; and

20 "(B) the Secretary of the Interior.

21 "SEC. 302. CIVILIAN CONSERVATION CENTERS WILDFIRE
22 AND CONSERVATION TRAINING PROGRAM.
23 "(a) SPECIALIZED TRAINING PROGRAMS.—The Sec-

24 retaries, in coordination with the Secretary of Labor, shall

offer at Civilian Conservation Centers specialized training
 programs focused on—

- 3 "(1) forestry and rangeland management;
- 4 "(2) wildland firefighting; or
- 5 "(3) any other topic relating to the mission of
 6 the Forest Service or the Department of the Interior
 7 or the public interest.

8 "(b) PRIORITIZATION.—The Secretaries shall
9 prioritize offering specialized training programs under
10 subsection (a) at facilities described in section 147(d) of
11 the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (29 U.S.C.
12 3197(d)).

13 "SEC. 303. WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING WORKFORCE DEVEL14 OPMENT PILOT.

15 "(a) IN GENERAL.—

16 "(1) EXPERIMENT, RESEARCH, OR DEMONSTRA-17 TION PILOTS.—The Secretary of Agriculture, in co-18 ordination with the Secretary of Labor, may carry 19 out experimental, research, or demonstration pilots 20 to provide career and technical education curricula 21 and course offerings to advance the missions of the 22 Department of Agriculture at Civilian Conservation 23 Centers operated by the Department of Agriculture, 24 including facilities described in section 147(d) of the

10	provide for a signing bonus to enable the successful
11	employment and transition of covered graduates, in-
12	cluding for the purpose of securing housing in rural
13	and remote communities.
14	"(b) DIRECT HIRE AUTHORITY.—For fiscal year
15	2025 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Secretaries may
16	appoint, without regard to the provisions of subchapter I
17	of chapter 33 of title 5, United States Code, other than
18	sections 3303 and 3328 of that title, a covered graduate
19	directly to a position for which the covered graduate meets
20	Office of Personnel Management qualification standards.
21	"(c) Pathways to Employment.—The Secretaries
22	shall ensure that appropriate career pathways are devel-
23	oped for covered graduates of relevant Civilian Conserva-
23 24	oped for covered graduates of relevant Civilian Conserva- tion Center training programs.

"(d) DISADVANTAGED YOUTH EMPLOYMENT.—Not withstanding any other provision of law, the Secretaries
 may employ covered students at regular rates of pay for
 necessary hours of work.

5 "(e) Use of Covered Students for Contracts, AGREEMENTS, AND GRANTS.—To the maximum extent 6 7 practicable, the Secretary of Agriculture shall encourage 8 the use of covered students to fulfill obligations under con-9 tracts, agreements, and grants relevant to the training ad-10 ministered by the Forest Service at a unit of the National Forest System where a Civilian Conservation Center is lo-11 12 cated.

13 "SEC. 305. WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING HOUSING PILOT PRO14 GRAM.

"(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretaries shall establish
a pilot program to employ covered students to improve and
expand the housing stock owned by the Federal Government for the purpose of housing wildland firefighters, volunteers, partner crewmembers, interns, and other agency
employees.

21 "(b) REQUIREMENTS.—In carrying out the pilot pro22 gram under subsection (a), the Secretaries shall—

23 "(1) identify properties currently owned by the24 Federal Government that would be appropriate

housing for wildland firefighters, volunteers, partner
 crewmembers, interns, and other agency employees;
 "(2) identify areas where the construction of
 new housing described in paragraph (1) would be
 appropriate and sustainable; and

6 "(3) submit to Congress a prioritized list of 7 projects for renovation with a plan for how the Sec-8 retaries will employ covered students to repair, ren-9 ovate, and remediate the properties identified under 10 paragraph (1).

11 "SEC. 306. REPORT.

12 "Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment 13 of this title, the Secretaries shall submit to the Committee 14 on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate and 15 the Committee on Agriculture of the House of Representa-16 tives a report—

17 "(1) describing underutilized capacity at Civil18 ian Conservation Centers, based on an assessment
19 conducted by the Secretaries; and

20 "(2) identifying the investments, improvements,
21 and efficiencies necessary to utilize the full capacity
22 of Civilian Conservation Centers.".
